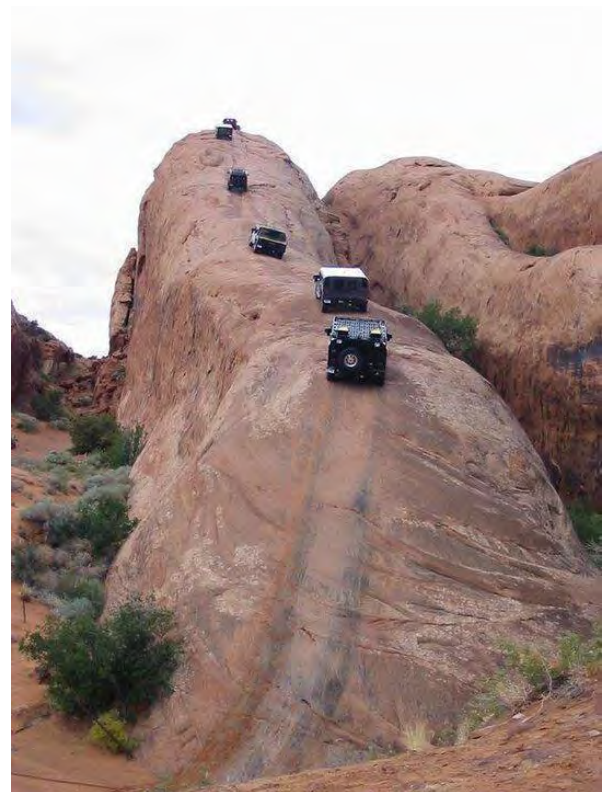
Run Leaders, please return signed hold harmless, liability waivers for Cheryl May, she is maintaining the archive.

State lawmakers in Sacramento recently passed Senate Bill 249 that permanently reauthorizes the California OHV Program. This historic vote-which also included Senate Bill 159, a companion bill that contained the funding structure for

the program-had precedent setting broad support from both the conservation and OHV communities.

Update on Legislation to Reauthorize the OHV Program in California - SB 249.

Just a few short months ago, we never would have believed we could take out 90% of the objectionable components of SB 249, and rewrite the bill using current law as the basis for moving forward. Because of your calls and communications to legislators and justified anger at the original language in SB 249, the OHV community was able to convince the author and legislative leaders to work collaboratively on this bill and it's companion bill SB 159. SB 249 removed the sunset for the California OHV recreation program, giving us a permanent program and grants program protected by statute!

Meeting Location: Flying J Gas Station in Frazier Park.
(Frazier Mtn exit off I-5), We will gas up at Flying J and then drive to the trail head.

Trail Description: Moderate trail. The first part of the trail is steep switchbacks and has some pretty good steps going up. Erosion may have increased the difficulty of some of these since the last run. A rear locker is recommended. The trail then follows ridgelines across the hills through a burnt-out area and then drops down through a series of switchbacks to Lockwood Creek. We will most likely stop for lunch at Piru Creek and then head up the hill on Miller Jeep Trail through two miles of rock garden to Dutchman Camp near the summit of Alamo Mountain. Add another 15 miles of easy fire road to descend the mountain to Hungry Valley OHVA.

Special Equipment: Minimum 31" tires but could have some trouble. Rear locker and high ground clearance strongly recommended.

Adventure Pass: Enforced. You can purchase the pass at some of the stores in Frazier for \$5 per day.

Camping: Camping is available at Hungry Valley Recreation Park. Several camping areas are available in the Hungry Valley OHVA, as well as up Alamo Mtn. Get off I-5 at Hungry Valley Road and head west about 4.5 miles. Campgrounds are on both sides of Hungry Valley Road near the jeep obstacle course, as well as right on Gold Hill Road. No reservations are necessary: camping is on a first come, first serve basis. Camping was \$10 per night and is collected at the ranger kiosk at the park entrance. water is NOT available anywhere in the recreation area. BYO.

Meeting Location: Big Pine Shell gas station, 109 S Main, Big Pine, CA.

Meeting Directions: Big Pine, CA is 245 miles (4 Hours) North of Riverside on CA-395.

Thursday night: Several motels and campgrounds in Lone Pine, Big Pine and Bishop area.

Run type: Moving camp tour.

Difficulty Rating: **Rated 1-2** Most all will be on maintained and un-maintained gravel roads, with the exception of crossing Eureka Dunes (2.5 miles of soft sand) **Rated 2-3**, two short rocky climbs in Dedeckera Canyon **Rated 2-3** going South to Steel Pass and then up the narrow Lippincott Mine Road **Rated 2-3**.

Temperatures: high 80s during the day, low 50's at night.

Trail Description: Tour of the more popular sites in the Death Valley National Park system.

Equipment Required: Stock vehicles with minimum of 31-inch tires and an air system capable of inflating tires.

Trailers: Welcome, off- road with minimum of 30-inch tires. You'll need to air them down also.

Permits Required: Access permit will be required when entering North Death Valley entrance.

Communications: HAM DD-1 (frequency 146.580 MHz) or CB Channel 4.

Bring: Bring food and extra water, chairs, basic tools, shovel, camera, extra weather appropriate clothing, etc.

Campground information: First night in Saline Valley – no permits required, second night Furnace Creek Campground fee is required

Day One-Friday: Big Pine (full gas tanks), Eureka Dunes, Dedeckera Canyon, Steel Pass, Saline Valley, Warm Springs (clothing optional area so don't be surprised) camping sites at the middle springs with pit toilet and outside showers.

Day Two-Saturday: South through Saline Valley, Lippincott Mine Road, Racetrack Playa, Tea Kettle Junction, Ubehebe Crater, (sorry, Scotty's Castle not open) Death Valley North entrance (fee area,) South to Furnace Creek Campground and gas station (don't be surprised gas prices a dollar higher than everywhere else.)

Day Three-Sunday: Furnace Creek Campground (full gas tanks), Chloride City, Rhyolite, Titus Canyon, Furnace Creek, Bad water, then South to Baker and home.

Head home Sunday afternoon.

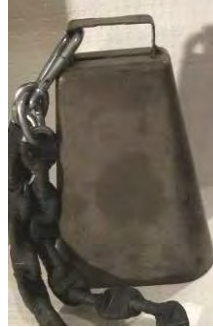
